The Worship Theme for December is Peace

The great Universalist minister and theologian Hosea Ballou preached that the God of love calls us to "happify" our lives. (He would also use terms like happification and religious pleasure.) Ballou wrote in his opus A Treatise on Atonement:

"Humanity's main object in all we do is happiness; and were it not for that, we never could have any other particular object. What would induce people to form societies, to be at the expense of supporting government, to acquire knowledge, to learn science, or till the earth, if they believed they could be as happy without as with?" *-edited*

When we worry too much, we drain our energy, our hopes even our passion for life. Our ability to take care of ourselves and others is impeded because we have focused our attention not on our passion, but on the exact opposite of passion, on apathy and indifference. Focusing our attention on indifference saps our desire to do the work that needs to be done. We need to pay attention to what drains us. We must also be aware of what bubbles forth joyfully from our strengths, what gets us excited, what moves us to do because doing makes us happy.

At this Christmas time it is easy for all us to get so frustrated with the commercialism

and the hustle and bustle that we throw up our hands and either go along or bury our heads in the sand. It is so important to do neither and instead to embrace those things about the holidays that excite you. The joy of being with family, the pleasure of giving to others, celebrating the return of longer daylight, it is these things that makes us happy, they please our souls, or as Ballou said they give us *religious pleasure*.

I hope that you find those things which *happify* you. I wish you and yours the joy of this season.

The Search Continues News from the Ministerial Search Committee

Our Congregational record goes live this week! The Congregational Packet is under development and we we working hard so it is ready for January.

.....

We mentioned last week that the Ministerial Search Committee will be operating in confidential mode starting next month. Confidentiality is a commitment that requires the participation of our entire congregation. If you should happen to find out information about a candidate we are considering, please keep that information to yourself. The following is information from the UUA on why confidentiality is so critical during this phase of the Search process.

UUA's guiding points regarding confidentiality during the Ministerial Search process. (Excerpted from the UUA Settlement Handbook for Ministers and Congregations)

- The committee must publicize the process it is following and how far along it is at every point. At the same time, the committee must keep confidential both the names and the locations of the ministers under consideration and the details of committee business.
- There are several reasons for the rule of confidentiality:
- Ministers settled in a congregation may not have told their present parishioners that they are
 contemplating a move. These parishioners are entitled to hear the news from their own
 minister at the appropriate time. To "leak" a minister's name can undermine his or her ability
 to serve the present congregation, and will almost certainly damage a committee's chances of
 attracting that potential candidate.
- When the identities of unsuccessful applicants are known, it heightens the competitive aspect
 of the search process. This hurts collegial feeling among ministers and (when neighboring
 congregations compete for the same minister) also can create hard feelings among
 congregations.
- It is harder to resolve differences among the members of a search committee when factions of the congregation are looking over its shoulders. It is better to resolve differences in private.

Ho, Ho it's December and it is busy at First Parish Milton. The outdoor wreaths were hung this week by Kevin Harnden on the new ladder. Miriam Saavedra is working on the final details on the Junior Youth Group visit to the Outdoor Church on Sunday. Myrtle Flight has been getting the meetinghouse decorated for the holiday season. David Egan is getting folks involved in projects with UU Urban Ministry and Father Bill's. The annual Milton Reisdent's gift program is underway and soon our meetinghouse will be full of gifts for Milton families from our church and many other Milton churches, schools and other organizations. Leslie MacPherson Artinian and the Venables among others have worked very hard to produce our new World Markets Fair and Brunch on Saturday.

We now are anticipating the furnace conversion from oil to gas will begin December 21st with the gas company setting up things and Williams Oil and Gas converting the systems the week of December 28.
